with workshops & events happening from Jan 17- Feb 21






# TOM ALLEN - JS BACH'S LONG WALK IN THE SNOW

With roots in Nunavut and a sound shaped by the haunting beauty of the North, they blend ancient katajjaq with ethereal, improvised compositions. Their performances are mesmerizing, political, and deeply atmospheric, a powerful act of cultural reclamation and resistance. *Oh Pray Tell* will open the evening.

#### THE MYRTLE SISTERS THEATER

Multi-award winning theatre artists Candice Roberts, Nayana Fielkov, and Kat Single-Dain, are a real life sisters trio from different parents. They have been charming their way into the hearts of folks for 10+ years touring with their shows across Western Canada in theatres, festivals and schools.



#### PAPER MOUNTAINS

Thursday, March 26

Paper Mountains is a powerful dance work set amid 1,000 paper planes, where five dancers embody memory, loneliness, and longing through urgent, physical movement. Created by Anya Allegra Saugstad from choreography born in isolation, the piece transforms personal stories into a collective act of remembrance and release.





#### DELHI 2 DUBLIN Thursday, April 9

Delhi 2 Dublin is a global bass powerhouse blending Bhangra, electronic, hip-hop, reggae, and Celtic music into a sound they call Subcontinental Pop. With high-energy shows and genre-defying tracks, they've electrified stages from Glastonbury to Burning Man. Featuring violinist Serena Eades and new member Kal Mattu, the band continues to push boundaries with hypnotic dhol, deep bass, and infectious hooks.
